Art techniques refer to the various processes and methods used by an artist to create a work of art. These techniques focus on drawing and painting, with the use of prospective mediums.

Drawing Materials

Drawing Mediums:

Graphite/Drawing Pencils or Sticks (Full Range of H & B Leads)

Color Pencils: Hue Pigmented Leads Charcoal: Compressed, Sticks & Pencils

Pastels (dry & oils)

Drawing Tools:

Stumps & Trillions

Charcoal, Graphite Pencils, Stumps & Tortillons.

Drawing Supports:

Artist Acid-Free Drawing Papers Various Textures & Finishes Masonite, Wood Panels, & Canvases

Medium Subtraction Tools

Erasers: Knead, Plastic, Gum

The principles of art refer to the elements of art that are used to create a work of art, such as line, shape, color, value, texture, and space.

Principles & Theories of Drawing and Painting

Pattern:	Shapes, Design, Outline, Form & Model
Contrast:	The difference, distinctions, disparities, & opposites
Emphasis:	Importance, Highlighting, & Distinction
Balance:	Equilibrium, proportion, symmetry, & stability
Harmony:	In Agreement, One-accord, Coherence, & unity
Rhythm:	The Flow of Objects, Shapes, Patterns, and Color Schemes
Proportion:	Ratio to Size & Location, Side by Side, background vs foreground

Methods are the steps taken by an artist to create a work, such as planning the composition, sketching, selecting materials, and executing the artwork. To gain a better understanding of these terms, reading up on the different techniques, principles, and methods used by famous artists is a great way to gain insight and inspiration.

- Premium fine-pigmented (oil, watercolor, acrylic) paints
- prepared supports (Panels, Wood, Hard-Boards, Various Surfaces, And/Or Canvas)
- Hardware and galvanized hanging wire

Painting Styles

- Scumbling.....(Dry Brush Painting)
- Alla Prima.....(Wet on Wet)
- Glazing......(Thin, semi-transparent layer of paint)
- Chiaroscuro...(*Light/dark*)
- Impasto......(thick layers of paint)
- Grisaille......(Completed in shades of grey or a different pale-neutral greyish color)
- Blocking In.....(Underpainting in blocks/shapes of color)
- Blending......(gradually fusing two or more colors or values with no lines of separation)

Artists use a variety of techniques, principles, and methods to create their drawings and paintings.

From the use of color and light to the application of different mediums such as paint, charcoal, graphite, pastels, ink, and other mediums affixed to prepared supports. Many artists also use composition, perspective, and form to create their pieces.

Understanding the fundamentals of color theory and the principles of design can help an artist create
