Oil Painting Glazing Technique

The Art of
Transparent Painting

Glazing in oil painting is a revered technique that allows artists to achieve striking depth, color richness, and luminosity in their works. This method involves applying thin, transparent layers of oily paint (usually increased oiliness with each new coat) over a dry underpainting, which can profoundly alter the color and mood of a piece. The glaze, typically a mixture of a single pigment and a medium (generally, paint thinner/turpentine, mixed with linseed, walnut, or poppyseed oil is spread thinly across the surface, allowing light to penetrate and reflect off the underlying layers, creating a glow that seems to emanate from within the painting itself.

It is a technique that requires patience and precision, as each layer must be fully dry before the next application. Glazing can enhance the perception of distance and form, adding a threedimensional quality to flat surfaces. This method involves applying multiple layers of transparent oil paint washes over a dry underpainting, allowing for a complex interplay of colors and tones that can bring a painting to life.

It is particularly effective in rendering complex details, such as the subtle tones of skin in portraiture or the vibrant hues of a sunset in landscapes. The practice pre-dates the Renaissance when it was used by masters to create works with enduring vibrancy and lifelike quality. Currently, it remains a fundamental skill in the repertoire of oil painters, enabling them to achieve effects that are unattainable through the direct, opaque application of paint. The choice of pigment, the ratio of medium to paint, and the order of applied layers all contribute to the finished outcome, making glazing a complex yet rewarding aspect of oil painting.

Supplies you need for glazing: transparent hue pigment, glazing medium, soft brush for washing, and firm brush for dry-brush effects. Keep in mind that there are many more colors available, and artists often create their specific unique palettes by mixing basic colors usually using one of the

The Art of Transparent Painting (continued)

Glazing Mediums

- Linseed Oil: Traditional and versatile.
- Walnut Oil: Less yellowing than linseed oil.
- Poppy Seed Oil: Also, less yellowing but dries slower.

Mix basic glaze medium of hue, oil, and

turpentine or paint thinner.

Use glazing to create amazingly exclusive effects in the oil painting. When light contacts the layers of pigmented hues it reflects off the first dense layer it strikes. Then it goes back and forth through consecutive translucent layers of color.

This means that the color(s) on the canvas is on purpose mixed optically rather than physically. This means that the layers of oil paint remain applied in a

way that the viewer can see them. Due to the multiple layers of hardened (dried) oil, the appearance of the painting has remarkable intensity and intensity of color that a painter could not achieve by mixing the hues on a palette and applying it in one dense thick, slightly intertwined layer.

The *brilliance (light)* achieved by painting with the glazing technique is what draws artists to paint with this method.

Drawing For Effects

The Technique Of Making Marks And Strokes

In our world of diverse forms of visual art, drawing is the building block, the foundation of these art forms that come into existence. Drawing has more to do with how drawing mediums such as charcoal, crayon, graphite, pastels, or any other drawing media produce marks on the drawing surface. Face it, visual art, like drawing, and paintings, are the two major forms of 2-dimensional fine art that apply to a dimensional flat sometimes rough or smooth surface which acts as the support. Art supports are nothing more than the surface to which the mark has been affixed, and preserved in a special process to endure a lengthy time. Acid-free artist papers or a prepared wood panel or a glass pane, and the most used is the artist canvas, strengthened on a wood frame and primed two or three times with Gesso. This Gesso comes in a tint (white) or toned (black).

The choice is made according to the artist's patrial of what the rendition entails as he or she works toward the look and feel of the finished art.

Throughout the entire drawing, the focus of the artist is how the finished master will feel and look, a bit more so what it will say about the artist and his/her work. However, before we can consider the finished artifact, we must start with the

beginning of the drawing even as far back as the preparation of the support. If the drawing support is a surface other than the artist's drawing paper, proper preparation is necessary to preserve and archive the art for a long time.

In today's market, there are hundreds of thousands of commercially prepared supports of sketches, drawings, and paintings. The choices can be overwhelming when choosing the correct one needed for your art project.

Here are a few support properties to consider:

- The size of the artwork ©
- A smooth or a teethed (rough) surface
- The material of the surface: (Board, Linen, Masonite.
 Canvas, artist's paper, or wood)
- Support surface preparation
- The underlayer color of the art

Consider the grain pattern as to the effect it will have on the finished work.

Now that full consideration has been given to the support, the next thing is the medium in which the art is to be in.



Monochrome Insight

When working with the mediums of charcoal and graphite alone, these pieces are colorless but can strike up a bold vivid contrast with a range of mid-tones/halftones (grays), (tints – (whites) lightness) and (tones – (black) darkness).

Neutral or noncolored art falls into the category of "Monochrome", it has no color determination and creates a "dull" work. Although incorporating one color into the mix will greatly change the outcome of the artwork. See EVENING FRUIT above.
